# Great Courses December 11th 10:00am

Discover a true story of power as a renowned professor surveys the rise and fall of the Roman Empire from 31 BC to the end of antiquity. **Presented by Gregory S. Aldrete, PhD. Gregory is the Frankenthal Professor of History and Humanistic Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay.** He received his BA from Princeton University and his PhD in Ancient History from the University of Michigan. His interdisciplinary scholarship spans the fields of history, archaeology, art history, military history, and philology. Professor Aldrete has won many awards for his teaching.

This month we continue with Lecture 9: Roman Literature. Latin literature was deeply influenced by its Greek predecessor, and the first wave of literature written in Latin – starting in 240 BC, when the first recorded play written in Latin, by Livius Andronicus, was staged in



Rome – seems to have consisted predominantly of imitations of Greek works, especially plays, and to have drawn its subject matter mainly from Greek mythology, such as the stories found in Homer's *Iliad* and *Odyssey*. Certainly, the Romans were composing many forms of writing prior to 240 BC, from complex formal ones to more personal and quotidian ones. Likely, there were also at least some written works that recorded Italic stories and histories. But all the way up until the last few centuries of the Roman Republic, such indigenous literary productions were not regarded very highly and remained very much in the shadow of the brilliant corpus of Greek literature.

## **December 12<sup>th</sup>: THURSDAY- John Bunker Sands Photography Gallery**

Intense flames, dramatic skies, firefighters at work, aircraft dropping fire retardant, ember trails, a "fire whirl" ascending.

A new special exhibition at the *Buffalo Bill Center of the West* shares dramatic images of wildland firefighting taken by a hotshot firefighter in the thick of the action. brave people who combat them. Photographed by Wyoming Hotshot Captain Kyle Miller, *Fire on the Mountain* provides an intimate encounter with the realities of a changing climate. Kyle began photographing wildfires in 2004 while serving on a fire crew in Montana. Over the past 20 years, he has gradually upgraded his camera equipment to better capture the fleeting moments of these intense natural events. A resident of Cody, Wyoming, Kyle



joined the Wyoming Interagency Hotshot crew in 2010. Hotshots are highly trained, specialized wildland firefighters who use various ground tactics and hand tools to slow and stop fires from spreading. The work is physically strenuous, mentally taxing, and requires a high level of conditioning in both body and mind. The images in this exhibition highlight two primary themes: **Fire Ecology** and the **Human Element of Wildland Firefighting**.

## New Property Tax Exemption for Veterans With a Permanent & Total Disability Rating

CT residents who served in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, or Space Force and have a service-connected permanent and total disability rating, as determined by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (U.S. DVA), are eligible for the exemption. We encourage all Veterans to file their DD-214 with the Town Clerks Office regardless if you are eligible for this exemption. There are other Veteran Exemptions available for those who do not meet these requirements.

You will not be asked if you need a pickup at home and any requests to change that status after you have paid will not be made. Request for a pick up at home IS NOT MADE THROUGH OUR TRANSPORATION DEPARTMENT. Once you have called to request your reservation for the trip and are placed into the system, your ticket will be purchased (if applicable). You will receive a confirmation call and you will be responsible for the payment within 2 days of notification.

The "Transportation Request Form" is not applicable for Senior Center Trips. This form is only for daily transportation. You MUST request home pick up at the time of making your reservation. You will not be asked when you make your reservation.

Trips Available for Members Only - Do not call Transportation to register for the trip.

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
