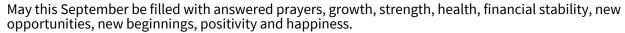

Great Courses September 11th 10:00 am

Great Courses The Roman Empire Discover a true story of power as a renowned professor surveys the rise and fall of the Roman Empire from 31 BC to the end of antiquity. Presented by Gregory S. Aldrete, PhD. Gregory is the Frankenthal Professor of History and Humanistic Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay. He received his BA from Princeton University and his PhD in Ancient History from the University of Michigan. His interdisciplinary scholarship spans the fields of history, archaeology, art history, military history, and philology. Professor Aldrete has won many awards for his teaching.

This month we continue with Lecture 6: The Five Good **Emperors** In AD 96, after the death of the emperor Domitian, the Roman Empire was forced to confront a fundamental defect in the structure of the principate" the hereditary method of selecting future emperors, established with a disproportionate number of leaderssuch as Caligula, Nero and Domitian- who were despotic, insane, or both. Roman culture was highly conservative and resistant to change, but the havoc caused by these rulers had been so

extreme that even the Romans were ready to contemplate adjusting their ideas about picking emperors.

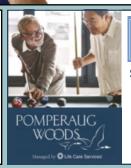
