## STATE

If you did not see the announcement on Thursday, Governor Lamont has issued the **Phase 3 Reopening Guidelines** for Connecticut, going into effect on October 8, <u>which you can view here</u>. Indoor event capacity has increased to 50%, capped at 100 people. Outdoor event capacity has increased to 50%, capped at 150 people. Restaurants, personal services, hair salons, barber shops, and libraries are now allowed to open at 75% capacity, up from 50%. In addition, indoor performing arts venues can now reopen at 50% capacity, with masks and social distancing requirements in place.

**Connecticut's Public Utilities Regulation Authority (PURA)** has issued a ruling that extends the enrollment period for the COVID-19 Payment Program for non-residential customers through November 1, 2020. You can learn more about this ruling <u>here</u>.
