URGENT - CT Recovery Bridge Loan Program Applications Due by 6:00 PM - TODAY, March 27, 2020

First 3 Actions: If you are business or worker impacted by the crisis

- 1. Apply for the State aid by: <u>6pm TODAY</u> <u>https://portal.ct.gov/coronavirus</u>
- 2. Apply for the <u>SBA Disaster Loan</u>, don't wait for the new CARE Act

CT Recovery Bridge Loan Program – deadline to apply: 6PM TONIGHT

- This is meant to be a <u>bridge loan</u>, to hold businesses over until they can receive federal funds. Business should still apply for the federal loans.
- \$75,000 or 3 months of operating expenses (whichever is lesser)
- 12 month term, with a 6 month extension available

- Small businesses and nonprofits with 100 or fewer employees; includes sole proprietors
- Must be negatively impacted by the coronavirus
- 4000+ applicants already, just since 3/25.
- 25 million (*first come, first served*). Another 25 million is soon-to-be allocated.
- Administered by DECD
- 2019 financials will be used

CT-DOL Shared Work Program allows employers directly impacted by the coronavirus pandemic to reduce the # of hours their workers who stay on-the-job, up to 10-60% reduction, and <u>their employees can also still apply for unemployment</u> and have those wages supplemented with unemployment insurance. The CARE Act – details are still emerging and are expected to be announced Monday

- SBA forgivable loans (first year if retaining employees even if part-time)
- Health insurance benefits, inc. PT, independent contractors, gig workers, nonprofit, etc.
- 2 trillion dollar economic package passed the Senate and goes before the House today
- Banks will be the distributors
- Aimed at encouraging employers to retain their employees.
- 12 months deferral and 2.5% of the full loan will be forgiven.
- 4% maximum interest
- If a company has already applied or is going to, for an SBA Disaster Loan, that loan can be "paid off" by this new loan. ie. If a company applies for \$75k of Disaster Loan and then is approved for 200k with the CARES program, the 75k can be paid off with it.

Still available

Economic Injury Disaster loans: Companies can apply for loans of up to \$2 million, through the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) here: <u>SBA Disaster Loan</u>. These loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the virus' impact. Interest rate is 3.75% for small businesses. TAX FILING DEADLINES

Federal Tax Filing extensions: The IRS has pushed back the tax filing deadline from April 15 to July 15, giving 2019 Taxpayers a three-month reprieve to pay the income taxes they owe up to \$1 million in taxes. Details are on the <u>IRS' Website</u>.

State Tax Filing extensions: The CT Department of Revenue Services has extended filing deadlines for certain annual state business tax returns. More here at: <u>DRS' Website.</u>
