"Save Small Business" initiative is open. Visit: www.savesmallbusiness.com

With the help of corporate and philanthropic funding, the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation has launched a "Save Small Business" initiative. This grant program is intended to provide short-term relief of up to \$5,000 to small employers who are struggling due to the COVID-19 shutdown.

According to the Foundation, eligible businesses must employ between 3 and 20 workers and have been harmed financially by COVID-19. They must also be located in an economically "vulnerable" community.

Today (April 20) at 3 p.m. the online application went live. Interested companies may apply by completing a short (10-minute) application and supplying a W-9 form and other basic supporting info.

The Foundation then will award grants of up to \$5,000 to successful applicants on a rolling, weekly basis until it exhausts its funds. Once the grantee has been notified and submitted payment information that meets compliance checks, it will take 3 to 5 days to process the payment, the Foundation says.

STATE

Important for business - the new mask requirements from State of Connecticut - Office of the Governor apply to workplaces too. Connecticut Department of Economic and Community Development issued the following guidance for workplaces: "Each employee shall be required to wear a mask or other cloth material that covers his or her mouth and nose at all times while in the workplace. Employers shall issue such masks or cloth face coverings to their employees. In the event an employer is unable to provide masks or cloth face coverings to employees because of shortages or supply chain difficulties, employers must provide the materials and CDC tutorial about how to create a cloth face covering, or compensate employees for the reasonable and necessary costs employees expend on such materials to make their own masks or cloth face covering."
