Important DOL Update

On May 7, the DOL issued new guidance which significantly reduces an employer's ability to request documentation from employees seeking leave under the FFCRA. Read: <u>WORKING</u>

PPP Loan Safe Harbor Period Expires May 14, 2020

Regarding Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loans, for those businesses and individuals fortunate enough to be approved for a PPP Loan from the U.S Small Business Administration (SBA), the clock is ticking on the safe harbor period, which is set to expire on May 14, 2020.

Because of recent guidance issued by the U.S. Department of <u>TREASURY</u>, it is advised that borrowers under this program should formulate financial projections setting forth an analysis of operational cash flow, liquidity and capital availability.
